



Overview

In today's globalized world, there is no such thing as a purely national private law. With that basic premise, the Athens Law School offers a one-year postgraduate programme entitled "**LL.M. in International and European Legal Studies**". The programme is divided into two separate specializations and is designed to provide its students with an in-depth understanding and a hands on knowledge of the European and international aspects of Private Law. Private law is examined in the light of primary and secondary EU law, judgments of the Court of Justice of the EU and international courts (such as the European Court of Human Rights), and decisions of European regulatory authorities.

Specializations

A. European Private Law

B. Private Law and Business Transactions

The choice of specialization is mandatory and is made at the initial application stage. Each semester students choose two core modules and two optional modules. The LL.M. programme is completed after the successful writing of a thesis in English, French or German. There is also the possibility of an internship in Greek legal entities at the end of the spring semester.

The programme is addressed to Greek and foreign graduates of law schools, legal practitioners, judges and anyone with relevant background interested in specializing in European and international aspects of private law.
