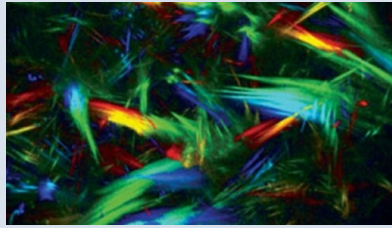

ENGLISH | ONLINE In the Autumn semester of 2022, the Department of Philosophy offers a series of online courses on Research Ethics. The series begins with an introductory course, which is followed by courses on Conduct and Misconduct, Harm and Consent, Values and Ethical Vetting. FREE-STANDING COURSES AUTUMN 2022



The Dynamics of Multilingualism: Encounters and Entanglements, 7,5 ECTS

ENGLISH | ONLINE The course addresses the need for a multidisciplinary approach in relation to the global challenges of increased mobility and multilingualism. It draws on different theoretical and methodological frameworks in order to investigate the complexities regarding identity, corporeality, language, place, ethnicity and other differences in relation to the new global zones of contact.



Advanced Studies in Linguistic Ethnography, 7,5 ECTS

ENGLISH | ONLINE The course deepens knowledge of the ontological and epistemological underpinnings of Linguistic Ethnography. It engages with LE's affordances and limitations in interdisciplinary arenas such as security studies and digital studies. It also addresses the implications for LE of southern and decolonial theory as well as new materialist and 'more than human' theories.

Previous knowledge or experience of working within LE is strongly recommended as this advanced course takes such knowledge as a starting point.

Academic Writing for International Publication, 7,5 ECTS

ENGLISH | ONLINE The overarching aim of the course is to improve the participants' academic writing skills in English in order to facilitate publication output in international peer-reviewed journals. Also included in the course is the preparation of monograph proposals.



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Application period: May 15 – June 15

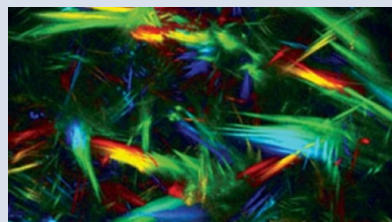
Applications for courses offered in the autumn semester of 2022 are received during the next application period, between May 15 and June 15. After June 15, the places are distributed and letters of confirmation, as well as notices of reserve positions, are sent out before Midsummer (Jun 25). Preliminary applications are also received for the courses offered in the spring semester 2023. The main purpose of the application period is to offer priority to PhD-students from the Faculty of Humanities at Stockholm University.

FREE-STANDING COURSES SPRING 2023



Methods for Handling of Text Data, 7,5 ECTS

ENGLISH | HYBRID The purpose of the course is to introduce basic theory and methodology for sampling, collection, preparation, annotation and analysis of text data in the humanities and social sciences, and to provide an overview of state-of-the-art language technology methods for automatically analysing large amounts of text.



The Dynamics of Multilingualism: Affinities and Affordances, 7,5 ECTS

ENGLISH | ONLINE The course deals with the emergence of new global linguistic communities, associated communicative practices, and the affordances that enable their existence. Different research issues are explored through empirical analyses of data

related to language phenomena, such as writing across languages, protest movements, or language and luxury tourism.
