CIVIS, Europe's Civic University Alliance, is a European University Alliance gathering 11 member universities: Aix-Marseille Université (France), National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (Greece), University of Bucharest (Romania), Université libre de Bruxelles (Belgium), University of Glasgow (UK), University of Lausanne (Switzerland), Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (Spain), Sapienza Università di Roma (Italia), Paris Lodron University of Salzburg (Austria), Stockholm University (Sweden) and Eberhard Karls Universität Tübingen (Germany).

Selected by the European Commission as one of the first 17 European Universities pilots, it brings together around half a million students and more than 70 000 staff members, including 37 400 academics and researchers.

How to get to Tübingen and around in Tübingen:

From Stuttgart Hauptbahnhof (Hbf, central station), you can take the IR6, MEX12 or MEX18 to Tübingen Hauptbahnhof. They will take between 45 and 60 minutes. You find timetable and can buy tickets <u>online</u> or at vending machines at the station.

From Stuttgart Airport, the airport shuttle "Airport Sprinter" (Bus route 828) runs hourly from the central bus stop in front of Terminal 1 of the arrival section. You can buy your ticket at vending machines inside the bus or directly from the bus driver. A single ticket costs 7,80 Euro. You can find the departure times here. The Airport Sprinter, which is marked by the sign of a little plane in the timetable, takes 50 minutes. Buses without this sign have more stops and therefore take 20min longer than the Airport-Sprinter. However, all buses No. 828 arrive at Tübingen main station.

Most CIVIS Days venues are within walking distance of most hotels. Alternatively, you can take the bus. An map of bus routes can be found here. You can also use Google Maps or the regional public transport app "Naldo" (Apple, Android) to plan your travel.

Below, we list the bus routes and stops for the three venues, which are not directly in the city-centre.

You can buy your ticket at **vending machines inside the bus**. You can pay with card, cash or your smartphone. A single ticket costs 2,80 Euro. You can also buy it within the Naldo app. And if you stay for the weekend in Tübingen, you can ride any bus for free on Saturday.

Internet access at the University of Tübingen:

If you are a member of an **eduroam** facility and a guest at the University of Tübingen, we recommend selecting the wifi SSID "eduroam". Enter your home university's login ID and password in form of <home login ID>@<home university. Country>. In case of problems, you will need to contact the support of your university.

Alternatively, the wi-fi UTguest is an open network, which does not require an account.

CIVIS – A Sustainably Connected Alliance

CIVIS aspires to be a sustainably connected alliance that enables free exchange and intensive cooperation. How can these solid connections among our universities best be developed to become long-lasting, inclusive and environmentally responsible? What should be our guiding principles? At this opening event of the 2023 CIVIS Days, we will explore these questions and provide opportunity for discussions. Students from partner universities in CIVIS will share their own experiences of the benefits of being able to move easily within the Alliance. Experts from CIVIS, other Alliances and the European Commission will comment on the key commitments that European University Initiative upholds and that CIVIS will put into practice: Greening and sustainability; inclusiveness and diversity; extending connectivity to partners on the African Continent; and engaging societal actors in our connected space.

An Innovative Academic Alliance: Showcasing the CIVIS Hubs

Hub 1: Taking on wicked problems in the Anthropocene. What is the role of education?

The challenges of the Anthropocene Epoch are multifaceted and complex. As Europe and the rest of the world emerges from the coronavirus pandemic, humanity is faced with an array of complex and interwoven challenges. The coupled climate, environmental and energy crises are at the centre of all of the challenges that face us today. These are wicked problems. This means that misguided and partial solutions can have unexpected and unwanted repercussions. Therefore, as we approach 2030, education must be a guiding force for solution finders. These solution finders need a new kind of education which leaves traditionally academic silos behind and approaches Anthropocene challenges in the transdisciplinary manner which wicked problems demand. This session will focus on the role of CIVIS in putting challenge-based transdisciplinary education centre stage in Europe.
